

Unfortunately for us skiers in the East, the 2015-16 winter season barely existed. Non-ski enthusiasts constantly annoyed us with comments about the 'great winter" we were having. Our hearts hurt for those who depend on the winter sports and travel industries. And our bodies itched to get outdoors in search of our favorite white powder. What could we do?

What we did, like many, was appreciate and enjoy the valiant snow-making efforts at our home mountain, Jack Frost, in the Pocono Mountains, and book a 10-day trip West! This year's excursion -- a week in Steamboat Springs followed by a long weekend in Breckenridge.

No matter the dates, when packing for a ski vacation one must prepare for

a wide variety of weather. That's exactly what we got -- cold windy days, warm days, a white-out snow day and many afternoons with gorgeous sunny views. Obviously, layering is key!

When gearing up at the base area, vacationers shouldn't be afraid to ask employees for tips regarding their favorite runs or which lifts will help avoid the crowds. We were happy to have our daughter along to serve as guide, having lived in Steamboat some years ago. Our plan was to get to high altitude and follow the sun.

Steamboat is known for it's incredible tree skiing, and it certainly did not disappoint. Prime spots: the grove of pines between Two O'Clock and Three O'Clock runs, and the beautiful aspens just below Four

Points Lodge. With plenty of snowfall this year, it was easy gliding through the peaceful woods where one can enjoy a bit of solitude, only to end up right at the base of a lift to send you on another lap!

Due to the nice weather, we didn't need warm-ups in the Lodge. Instead, we rode Tomahawk's elbow, Baby Powder, to a perfect photo spot complete with picnic table nestled in the snow. The view includes the Sleeping Giant, a peak that stands alone outside Steamboat Springs, rumored to wake in 2020.

Refueled and ready for more riding, we headed to the family favorite, Morningside Park. Be sure to stash a bit of granola for the tame Jays who will land on your outstretched hand as you ride up Morningside Lift. From there you can drop into chutes, ride some open space, or aim for the trees -- what more can one ask for? We enjoyed the Hike-to-Trail opportunity, bringing

> us to 10,568' at the highest peak, for some bonus turns on Wake Up Call.

Tired, but not ready to end the day, we often found the T Bar to be just what we needed for après ski beverages with the locals, keeping us outdoors in the sunshine. Other days we chose to head into the charming town for a bit of shopping or a bite to eat. Don't miss Carl's Tavern on Yampa Street for fun atmosphere, open table dining and excellent food. On your way in or out you can say a few words to the restaurant's namesake, Carl Howelsen, the legendary local ski jumping pioneer whose statue stands at 17th and Lincoln.

Vonn Crushes Kandahar Downhill

GARMISCH-PARTENKIRCHEN, Germany (Feb. 6, 2016) – Lindsey Vonn (Vail, CO) absolutely crushed the Kandahar downhill course in Saturday's Audi FIS Ski World Cup to take her record 76th World Cup victory.

Vonn's winning time of 1:40.80 was 1.51 seconds faster than Switzerland's Fabienne Suter in second. Germany's Viktoria Rebensburg was third.

"It was a great day!" Vonn said. "Every day is a new chance to break my own record, which is kind of weird to say, but it still makes it exciting. Every win for me is more special than the last. And my dad is here, so it's really special."

Lauren Ross (Bend, OR) posted her fifth-career top five downhill result - finishing fifth on the fast and bumpy classic Kandahar track for her best result of the season. Stacey Cook (Mammoth Mountain, CA) was 17th, Jacky Wiles (Aurora, OR) 21st and Breezy Johnson (Salt Lake City, UT) posted a career best World Cup finish in 28th. Alice Merryweather (Hingham, MA), making her third career World Cup start, finished 37th.

Vonn extended her overall World Cup lead over Switzerland's Lara Gut, who finished a disappointing 14th, to 127 points. Vonn also leads the World Cup downhill standings by 162 points over Canada's Larisa Yurkiw, who was fourth Saturday.

Weather and inconsistent course conditions have been a challenge at numerous World Cup stops this season, and this week at Garmisch was no exception. In Thursday's downhill training run - also won by Vonn - the course was slowed by wet, heavy snow. For Saturday's race, it was a completely different situation with a hard, fast and bumpy snow surface, thanks to the countless hours the course crew put into preparing the track.

"It was definitely a lot different today than it was in the training run, pretty much a totally different course," Vonn said. "It was definitely bumpy ... and very flat light in some sections."

"It was a little bit rough out there," Ross added. "It was definitely a lot faster than (Thursday's) training run, completely different snow. It was kind of like a super G day, where you really didn't know what was going to happen; the line changed in places and it was really bumpy."

Only two of the first seven racers crossed the finish line, including Wiles, who took the early lead as the next three competitors, including teammate Alice McKennis (New Castle, CO) failed to finish. Meanwhile, Vonn was watching the race at the start.

"I could see that there where some problems," Vonn said. "There were some bumps, and the problem is that the bumps were right in the compressions, and also where there were shadows, so you couldn't really see anything.

"It was definitely bumpy ... and very flat light in some sections," Vonn continued. "I was able to execute it well in the right places, and carry my speed through the whole course."

Vonn goes for World Cup victory No. 77 in Sunday's super G. Watch it live on NBC Sports Live Extra at 4:45 a.m. EST.







CRANS-MONTANA, Switzerland (Feb. 15, 2016) – Mikaela Shiffrin (Eagle-Vail, CO) returned from injury to dominate the Audi FIS Ski World Cup slalom Monday, taking her 18th World Cup victory.

"That was a pretty incredible race," said Shiffrin, who suffered a knee injury warming up for a race in December. "I'm glad it's over, but I enjoyed skiing that last run, it was really rough and a challenge at every single gate. It was just bumpy and a wild ride – tough, but a good fight, and that's the way it should be."

Proving that her rehab and training over the past couple of weeks had prepared her to return to top form, Shiffrin soaked up the first run sunshine and support from an enthusiastic crowd cheering her to the finish. She cruised into the first-run lead by 0.27 seconds.

"I was really nervous for the first run," she said. "So nervous that I thought I left my legs at the start. But the second run was better, I felt like I was back in the groove."

And indeed she was! Starting as the final racer in the second run, Shiffrin watched as racer after racer battled deteriorating course conditions and visibility issues as clouds shrouded the upper portion of the course. In dominating fashion though, she extended her first-run advantage through the rutted course and cruised to victory by 0.45 over France's Nastasia Noens. Marie-Michele Gagnon of Canada finished third.

"There were some scrappy turns ... none of the girls skied their best, and I didn't ski my best," Shiffrin said of the challenging course conditions. "It was just one of those things where you had to be really mentally tough, and I'm glad my mental side is there, because that component is tough to get back."

Resi Stiegler (Jackson Hole, WY) skied to her best slalom result of the season in eighth. "I feel awesome," Stiegler said. "But I'm still hungry for more. I wasn't totally satisfied with today, but I'm very, very happy. Starting the second run with a better position for getting toward the podium is huge for me."

Lila Lapanja (Incline Village, NV) showed significant promise starting 43rd in the first run, skiing to a 17th place first run finish. However, she got caught in a rut on the top section of the course, straddled, and failed to finish.

"I didn't want to ski to finish for just points," Lapanja said. "I just wanted to go, and go and go. I went a little too direct tactically where I needed to give a little bit. So, it didn't work out, but the mental approach is getting pretty strong and I definitely can't wait until Jasna (Slovakia, March 5-6)."

Up next, the women's tour moves to La Thuile, Italy for two downhill races – including a make-up from Crans-Montana – and a super G race Feb. 20-21, then to Soldeu-El Tarter, Andorra for super G and alpine combined events Feb. 27-28. Jasna, Slovakia will host giant slalom and slalom events on March 5-6.





Finally, a trip to Steamboat isn't complete till you've visited Strawberry Park Natural Hot Springs out County Road 36. Relaxing on the smooth rocks in the all natural pools of hot mineral water while admiring the snowy mountain woodlands surrounding the park....ahhhhhhh.

Lucky for us, having to leave Steamboat didn't mean the end of our family vacation. We chose to drive the two hours into Summit County and add a bonus long weekend in Breckenridge to the trip. There was a transition from the sleepy small-town charm of Steamboat to bustling, busy Breckenridge -- both having a personality of their own. While Breck was more crowded (and our trip

there fell on the weekend), they have a large mountain to handle all the snow enthusiasts from peak to peak to peak...

Again, to avoid the crowds, our plan was to head to high altitude right away. Because Breckenridge looms above the tree line, the top peaks offer enticing bowls where one can often make their own tracks in fresh powder. Peak 6 is the newest addition, where even intermediate skiers can enjoy blue trails on the otherwise out of reach bowls. Conditions and crowds steered us to the T bar, giving us access to a fun section of terrain at skier's right of Peaks 7 and just under Imperial's Peak 8 (with 12,998' the

highest in-bounds terrain).

For those of us from much smaller ski areas, it's amazing to find one can spend an entire day skiing and only touch a few sections of this imposing mountain. Day 2 we decide to explore the other side, sticking to the groomed trails on Peak 9 and steeper trails on Peak 10. Two days was still not enough time to explore the entire area and experience the wide variety of terrain.

Breck offers quite a bit of Hike-to-Terrain, as well. Even though these sections are considered in-bounds, they can still be dangerous for those unfamiliar to the area or unprepared for changing weather conditions. It's worth a quick stop at Underground Snowboards for advice or needed gear from the experts who specialize in back-country needs. For forgotten accessories or the latest in sunglasses or goggles, check out the extensive collection at

Sun Logic.

Après ski time brings everyone to Main Street, with block after block of retail shops, boutiques, restaurants and bars. For a casual bite, we headed to The Motherloaded Tavern where the fun starts when you walk through the door. Their menu is unique, including items such as Spam Fries and Salmon Fish & Chips. For a more upscale choice, try Twist or the South Ridge Seafood Grill, both just a block up from Main Street.

Always sad to end a fun vacation back to real world responsibilities, we were happy to bring with us great memories of our new favorite mountains, Steamboat and Breckenridge. Our 2015-16 winter season was salvaged with thanks to Colorado snow!


