As the cold weather begins in Northeast Pennsylvania, skiers will soon start their dismounts down some of the best mountains in the area. The cold temperatures are not quite here yet, but for local ski resorts, the time is quickly approaching.

Local ski resorts are eyeing mid-December as the point where they can ramp up operations and really ignite the snowmaking process.

"It looks like the forecast is beginning to change and then we can get back to making snow," Jack Frost-Big Boulder general manager Mark Daubert said. "Once the change in the weather comes we will rock 24 hours a day. The plan

is from December 8-16, the whole week looks great for us, to make snow so we are excited."

In the meantime Jack Frost-Big Boulder has stayed busy helping the local community with a can food drive. Participants brought can goods to the resort and they were donated to St. Peter the Fisherman church in Lake Harmony. The church then distributed the goods to local food banks.

Big Boulder was also able to open a trail in early December to allow skiers an opportunity to hit the slopes early. The plan remains to pump the snowmaking process once the cold weather hits and open more trails as soon as possible.

Montage Mountain has a similar plan to crank up snowmaking. The resort was made significant strides in their snowmaking process to put a stronger product out

for the skiers. With the temperatures dripping in the next weeks, Montage will be prepared.

"Next week we are looking to make some snow," Montage Mountain Director of Marketing Jeff Slivinski said. "The temperatures will be in the 20s and 30s so we will be looking to really push it for those 10 days. We are looking to get some trails open by December 17th or 18th."

Shawnee Mountain has made improvements to their snowmaking process this season. The resort has installed over 3,000 feet of new snowmaking pipe on the Tecumseh and Lookout trails which will be ready for skiers to enjoy.

Other local resorts like Blue Mountain, Camelback, and Elk Mountain are also awaiting the beginning of the snow making process. Elk Mountain has

added 13 new snow guns in November.

It will only be a few more weeks until the preparations are underway and skiers can begin to enjoy the fruits of labor. Montage will offer some opportunities for new skiers to hit the slopes for free. On the two Fridays before Christmas, Montage will offer some free days. If you are a first timer, you can get a free lift lesson and rental package.

"We are really looking forward to the start of the season," Slivinski said. "Our membership has grown and they are excited about the great things that have happened at Montage. Our snowmaking has come a long way and our slopes and terrain are getting better every year."

So as the holidays approach and family gathers, local ski resorts will have opportunities to get out and enjoy all these mountains have to offer.




Shiffrin Shines In Killington Slalom

Coming in as the odds-on favorite, Shiffrin had a couple of small bobbles in her second run, but put aside all the pre-race pressure to extend her first-run lead and win by .73 seconds ahead of Veronika Velez Zuzulova of Slovakia to take her 21st World Cup win. Wendy Holdener of Switzerland was third.

"It's been incredible," said Shiffrin. "I knew it was going to be a big one, and special, and I was so excited. It's the east coast, I know this place, I know these people love to watch ski racing. I'm so proud that they all came out and really cheered that loud!"

But Shiffrin admitted that she was nervous and feeling down prior to the race. "I put a lot of pressure on myself," she said. "I went through a moment where I was thinking maybe I shouldn't do this. I was so worked up and nervous and worried about the wrong things."

However, Shiffrin's day ended on a high note on Killington's Superstar Trail, as she came through the finish and uncharacteristically celebrated when she saw the number 1 next to her name. Her whole family was there to watch, while she was particularly excited about skiing in front of her grandmother for the first time ever. "The fact that my nana was able to watch this race is amazing," said Shiffrin. "I can't put that into words. The proudest I've ever been is winning this race in front of my nana."

Sunday's crowd was equal to Saturday's 16,000 fans, bringing the total to more than 30,000 fans in total to attend the Killington World Cup—the first World Cup in the east coast in 25 years. Every kid was smiling, as they waved flags and asked for autographs from their favorite skiers. "It was incredible," said Shiffrin. "Today you could peak over the break in the hill and see everybody. I could hear them chanting USA before my run. In these kinds of races, the crowd totally carries me down the hill."

U.S. Ski and Snowboard Association President and CEO Tiger Shaw was also present at the race. "This event at Killington will have a lasting impact on this sport for a decade or more to come," said Shaw. "The excitement and the motivation that this will generate for kids in New England in insurmountable and will help grow the profile of alpine skiing in the country."

It's been incredible. Racing in front of the east coast has been an emotional high for me. Then there's been the pressure side of things—I put a lot of pressure on myself. I've been perform-

ing so well in slalom and I knew I had a great chance of winning the slalom here, coming into today. I woke up this morning, though, and I had a bad feeling about today. I went through a moment where I was thinking maybe I shouldn't do this. I was so worked up and nervous and worried about the wrong thing. It wasn't very enjoyable until the second run—the fight I put into the course and staying in the course even after making some bobbles here and there. I hope I looked like I wanted to ski fast because that was what my goal was. I'm still looking to put my best training skiing into a race.

I think that role of being an inspiration for younger girls is growing. As more people tell me that I inspire them, I start to inspire myself more as well. I'm not the most confident person—I tend to have a lot of self-doubt, but I'm generally a really happy person. Sometimes these races get to me. I feel like I have to be something special or different or get someone else's approval—the crowd, the media. Today, I tried to make the choice that I don't need approval. That's the message to these young girls that's more important than my skiing. I ski for myself, not for anybody else.

I work my tail off. Everybody does. All these girls are trying to beat me. But I'm not even close to my best skiing. I'm doing my thing and I'm a happy person. It's great to be back here and get a breath of that freshness.

Blue Mountain

Autumn color has morphed to the crisp feel of winter in the mountains of Pennsylvania. Ski trails and terrain parks are echoing to the final touch-ups for the launch of a new snow-sports season. Skiers, riders and tubers will see dynamic changes on and off the slopes. Across Pennsylvania, from the Poconos to the Alleghenies, expanded terrain will welcome "First-Timers". New terrain park features, lift overhauls and enhanced snowmaking will accent the slopes. More restaurants and lodging are in the mix, a laser light show will dazzle a major tubing park and look for an explosion of budget friendly packages. What's where and what's new? Here's what.

THE EAST

The growing 4-season complex at **BEAR CREEK MOUNTAIN RE-SORT** is catapulting into winter with a dynamic facelift in the restaurants and lodge to provide a colorful frame for eye-catching views of the mountain while dining or lounging at the pool or spa. This season will see more dollar-stretching options for cruising on Bear Creek's 21 trails, terrain parks and the

tubing runs . On Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday (non-holiday) Loyal Ski Club members enjoy all day skiing for just \$22 with a club membership. College students will cash in on the same deal. Also look for more creative "Ski and Stay" packages that combine lodging in the 116 room "Ski-in - Ski-out" hotel with lift tickets, dining and Spa. On the mountain, snowmaking keeps up with modern technology to produce more snow, faster than ever before.

A blizzard of new features have exploded on the terrain parks of **BLUE MOUNTAIN.** What makes them unique is their origin. The moun-

bought a lumber yard that recycles fallen slopeside trees into park features. Now, that's thinking boxes - and rails. New skiers and riders have a lot more room to ramble this season. You'll find expanded territory to enhance terrain based learning techniques on the upper third of Frontier Alley. Adult learners at Blue Mountain will also see expanded features on Valley School West. To ease back between runs, look for a new look and landscape on the Summit Terrace. And if you gaze all the way up to the left of the mountain, you get a sneak peak at a 40th Blue Mountain trail, set to open next winter.

CAMELBACK MOUNTAIN which has come off a robust summer season of water park action, has added a dramatic laser light show to the dynamics at the largest Snowtubing park in the country. The 42 lightning fast lanes of Galactic Snow Tubing launches an "out-of-this-world" light extravaganza to the excitement of tubing. Camelback Lodge, a 163 million dollar "Ski-In-

Ski-Out" hotel that has been crafted around the largest indoor waterpark in the Northeast begins its second winter season at the base of Camelback Mountain. Visitors will find 453 suites for destination accommodations, 7 pools and 13 water slides in the naturally lit "AQUATOPIA".



Shiffrin Scores a Victory in Levi

KITTILÄ, Finland (Nov. 12, 2016) – Mikaela Shiffrin (Eagle-Vail, CO) overcame Audi FIS Ski World Cup slalom opener nerves, skiing two clean and solid runs en route to her first World Cup victory of the 2017 season. Switzerland's Wendy Holdener grabbed second, .67 seconds out, while Slovakia's Petra Vlhova rounded out the podium in third, .75 seconds behind Shiffrin.

It was a beautiful, crisp day up in Lapland, with a picturesque sunrise and perfect rock-hard conditions on the race track. Starting lucky number seven, Shiffrin laid down a smoking first run, finishing .72 ahead of 2016 World Cup slalom title holder Frida Hansdotter and Switzerland's Wendy Holdener. The battle between Shiffrin and Hansdotter ended when Hansdotter straddled on the pitch second run and skied out. Shiffrin knifed the bulletproof pitch and maintained her lead all the way to the finish, earning herself another prize Lapland reindeer and a buddy for her 2013 prize reindeer Rudolph. His name? Sven.

Shiffrin channeled early race day nerves to work in her favor. "I didn't have many expectations. I was quite nervous this morning," recalled Shiffrin. "I just tried to put it aside, put my head away and just ski really hard. I made a few small mistakes—a couple things that hopefully the next race I can clean up a little bit. I know these other girls aren't going to wait around.

They're trying to beat me, so I have to keep going."

Much like Soelden, Levi is a bit of an outlier race on the World Cup circuit—no one really knows where they are until it happens. Though Resi Stiegler (Jackson WY) typically struggles with losing time in the final split, she was able to make up some time at the bottom of her second run, skiing into a solid 16th place. Prior to the race, Stiegler she noted that she was still working on dialing in her skiing and body for the season, but she is relieved to have the first race in the books. "First run I think I had some nerves," said Stiegler. "Then second run I was like, 'It's time to improve. Let's just ski better second run and not worry too much about the result today,' and it was better. There are still some things I need to work on, but I'm happier that I improved for that run. It's so beautiful here and it's nice to have some winter conditions finally. Everything feels really good. The snow was excellent—it's nice, hard snow—and a great atmosphere."

The final American starting in Saturday's slalom and a relative newcomer to the World Cup circuit, Lila Lapanja (Incline Village, NV), had solid top splits that would have had her well into qualification for a second run but struggled moving forward coming on to the pitch, causing her to get low and behind. She'll walk away knowing that she has the speed to hang

with the top 15.

The women will head to Colorado for a training block before traveling to the highly anticipated Killington World Cup on November 26 for a giant slalom, followed by a slalom on November 27. It is Killington's first time hosting a World Cup and the first time the east coast has hosted a World Cup since 1991.

On first run performance

First run felt good. I was quite nervous this morning, so I'm really happy with where I'm at and I attacked really hard. Sometimes when I'm nervous I get really passive, so I tried to go the opposite direction and almost try to ski too hard. It ended up being just the right balance. I think I can clean it up second run even better. We'll see what happens. I'm psyched with where I'm at right now.

On the race today

It was a great race. The hill was in really, really perfect condition and it was a beautiful day. So, I'm happy...but I also know I can be faster. I think the other girls will be faster as well. It takes a lot of energy. It's fun, and when I ski my best it's easier. The better I ski, the easier it is, and more simple. So I always shoot with the most simple skiing and just try to get to the finish as fast as I can. I'm psyched with how that worked today.

On race day nerves

I didn't have many expectations. I was quite nervous this morning. So I just tried to put it aside, put my head away, and just ski really hard. I made a few small mistakes—a couple things that hopefully the next race I can clean up a little bit. I know these other girls aren't going to wait around. They're trying to beat me, so I have to keep going.

On being unbeatable

I am not unbeatable. I can tell you that. And I think a lot of these girls know that and they're shooting to be the first to beat me now. So every race I have to be faster, and it's certainly not a comfortable position.







high tech, big throw energy efficient electric fan guns have been added for the Tomahawk lift base area. This winter, Shawnee is making it easier than ever to arrive at the mountain, hands free, unburdened by an armful of gear. The rental shop is now able to outfit over 4,000 skiers and riders with the latest state-of-the-art equipment. New additions this season include 100 new sets of Elan skis, 150 pair of new Dalbello ski boots, 50 new Flow snowboards and 100 new Flow snowboard boots. And racers get an extra jump out of the NASTAR gate. The Shawnee Mountain Ski and Snowboard School has purchased new ALGE wireless electronic timing equipment for its popular recreational ski racing program and for its youth development racing school.

Season ticket holders at twin resorts **JACK FROST and BIG BOULDER** get a big lift this season. Their tags are now good for skiing and riding at high energy Hunter Mountain in New York. Frost/Boulder operators PEAK RESORTS has ponied up nearly 37 million dollars for the Empire State slopes and added them to the Pennsylvania season ticket that already covered sister areas

Mount Snow in Vermont, Attitash, Crotched Mountain and Wildcat in New Hampshire. Meanwhile, back in the Poconos, there'll be dynamic skiing in the "Glades" of Jack Frost this season with extensive tree trimming and configuration. Getting around the mountain will be easier with new signage, and look for blizzards of early season snow with another upgrade of the snow making system. On the lodge side, the Frosty Toboggan eatery gets a dazzling new entertainment schedule and a tuned up apres ski menu. Over at Big Boulder, plans to get an early start to the riding season are backed up with revamped snow system pumps and guns, along with spruced up lifts and lodge.



White Haven, PA – October 2016 - Fourth and fifth graders who want to ski or snowboard are fortunate especially if they live in or near Pennsylvania. For the thirteenth year, the Pennsylvania Ski Areas Association (PSAA) is making skiing or snowboarding free through their Snowpass program for youths in those two grade levels.

Skiing and snowboarding offers families the opportunity to exercise outside together during the winter months. A ninety pound youth can


